

#### Day 1: No Condemnation, No Separation

Reading: Romans 8:1-39

Devotional: As we begin this journey, let's reflect on the profound truth that in Christ, there is no condemnation and no separation from God's love. This passage reminds us of our complete acceptance and security in Christ. How often do we live as if we're still under condemnation or separated from God? Today, meditate on the freedom Christ has given you. How might your life look different if you fully embraced this truth? Consider how this assurance might embolden you to share God's love with others without hesitation.

#### Day 2: Praying Dangerously

Reading: Matthew 7:7-11, Luke 11:5-13

Devotional: Today's passages challenge us to pray boldly and persistently. The sermon we heard encouraged us to move beyond "safe" prayers and ask God for big things. What areas of your life or the lives of others have you been hesitant to bring before God? Take some time to write down a "dangerous" prayer - something that seems impossible without God's intervention. Remember, our Father delights in giving good gifts to His children. How might persistent, bold prayer change your relationship with God and your perspective on His power?

#### Day 3: The Urgency of the Gospel

Reading: Luke 13:22-30, Matthew 7:13-14

Devotional: These are challenging passages that remind us of the urgency of the gospel message. Jesus speaks plainly about the reality of judgment and the narrow path to salvation. How does this affect your view of evangelism? While these truths may be difficult, they're motivated by God's love and desire for all to be saved. Reflect on how you can balance sharing both the "sweet" and "salty" aspects of Jesus' teachings. Ask God for boldness to speak truth in love, even when it's uncomfortable.

#### Day 4: Empowered Witness

Reading: Acts 4:23-31

Devotional: The early church's response to persecution was not to retreat, but to pray for greater boldness and divine demonstrations of God's power. Their prayer acknowledged God's sovereignty while asking for courage and supernatural confirmation of the gospel message. How might your prayers change if you adopted this mindset? Today, ask God to fill you afresh with His Holy Spirit. Pray for opportunities to speak boldly about Jesus and for God to work in miraculous ways that draw others to Him.

#### Day 5: Living as Sent Ones

Reading: John 20:19-23, Matthew 28:16-20

Devotional: As we conclude this week, let's focus on our identity as those sent by Jesus into the world. Just as the Father sent Jesus, He now sends us. This calling isn't just for a select few - it's for every believer. Reflect on the areas of your life where God has placed you. How can you be more intentional about living as a "sent one" in your family, workplace, or community? Ask God to help you see the people around you through His eyes and to give you courage to share His love in both word and deed.
