

Day 1: The Way, the Truth, and the Life

Reading: John 14:1-14

Devotional: Jesus' bold claim to be "the way, the truth, and the life" challenges us to examine our faith deeply. Just as the early Christians faced persecution for their unwavering belief in Christ, we too must consider what we truly believe about Jesus. Reflect on how your life demonstrates that Jesus is your way, truth, and life. How can you more fully embrace His teachings and example in your daily walk? Remember, this isn't just about following a set of rules, but about a transformative relationship with the living God.

Day 2: The Power of Eyewitness Testimony

Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Devotional: The resurrection of Jesus is the cornerstone of our faith, attested to by numerous eyewitnesses. As you read Paul's account, consider the impact of firsthand testimony. How does the reality of Christ's resurrection affect your life today? Just as the early believers were transformed by what they saw, allow the truth of the resurrection to reinvigorate your faith. Day 3: Examining the Evidence

Reading: Acts 17:10-15

Devotional: The Bereans were commended for their diligent examination of the Scriptures. In a world full of competing ideologies, it's crucial that we too carefully examine the evidence for our faith. Take time today to dig deeper into a aspect of Christianity you've always wondered about. Research historical evidence, consult trusted commentaries, or discuss with a mature believer. Remember, honest inquiry strengthens true faith. Ask God to reveal Himself to you through your study and to deepen your understanding of His truth.

Day 4: The Uniqueness of Christ

Reading: Colossians 1:15-23

Devotional: Jesus stands unique among all religious figures in history. As you read Paul's powerful description of Christ's supremacy, reflect on what sets Jesus apart in your own understanding and experience. How does His divine nature, coupled with His human experience, speak to your deepest needs? Consider how Jesus' uniqueness challenges the notion that all spiritual paths are equal. Pray for a renewed appreciation of Christ's incomparable nature and for opportunities to share this truth with others.

Day 5: Faith in the Face of Skepticism

Reading: 1 Peter 3:13-17

Devotional: In a skeptical world, we're called to be ready to give a reason for the hope we have. This doesn't mean having all the answers, but being grounded in the truth of the gospel and our personal experience of Christ. Reflect on your own journey of faith. What evidence, both from Scripture and your life, gives you confidence in the truth of Christianity? Practice articulating your faith clearly and lovingly. Ask God for wisdom to engage respectfully with those who doubt,

always pointing to the transformative power of Christ's love and the historical reality of His resurrection.
